## What have you felt has been the main thing or main things that God has revealed to you during your time in Korea?

Definitely, the main thing was that God wanted me to receive a taste of His love for us. When I would get rejected and loved by the children at the same time, I really wondered how God put up with all our rejections and the times when we would suddenly turn our backs on Him. I also just got spoken to from the word in 1 Peter 1:6-9 this morning and it really made me think and reflect on Korea up until now. He basically was training me to have more faith in the midst of all the hardships I was going through, and serving in Korea definitely helped me in this. Also, another thing I felt God was doing was allowing me to expand my views on how life is like overseas. Basically, I felt like He was giving me a preview before I really make my decision on whether or not to serve overseas.

#### Please share or list some of the joys of your time here.

I really loved taking a couple of our students to COEX mall for a "field trip." The pension trip was awesome. The times at JSEM were a blessing to say the least.

#### Please share or list some of the difficulties of your time here.

It's definitely keeping up with QT's and being diligent in prayer. Staying committed was so hard. Reaching out to the kids in the beginning was really difficult.

Tell them to really stay consistent in their QT/prayer before they come to Korea. Also, tell them to stay as long as possible. The longer the stay, the stronger the relationships get with your kids.
